FOR RESIDENTS OF MULTIFAMILY DWELLINGS

Recycle Guide

Multifamily Dwellings (MFDs) with 5 or more units are required to arrange for both recycling and organics collection services. Recology can provide tools and guidance to meet state requirements.



MULTIFAMILY SERVICES INCLUDE

Organics Collection

Reduced rate for collection services of food scraps and yard waste; yard waste can no longer be placed in the garbage.

Environmental Days

Three times per year, residents are invited to drop off electronic waste for safe recycling, securely shred paper on-site, and pick up free compost during these events in Hollister and San Juan Bautista.

Neighborhood Cleanup

Managers can request large bins for garbage, recyclables, and litter cleanup.

Bulky Item Collection

Twice yearly, owners of MFDs can arrange for the collection of bulky items and reusable materials at no additional cost.

Technical Assistance & Training

A waste zero specialist can provide free training and resources to property owners, managers, tenants and maintenance staff to increase recycling, reduce waste and potentially save money.
