Document Shredding: *San Carlos residents can bring up to 3 standard banker boxes (10 x 12 x 15) of documents to the San Carlos Corporation Yard for on-site secure shredding. Shred event lasts until 1:00 p.m. or until the truck is full - whichever comes first. Proof of residency required.*



DID YOU KNOW?

Plastic bags are **NOT** allowed in the green compost bin.



Why?

- Plastic bags don't break down or decompose.
- Plastic bags contaminate finished compost.
- Plastic bags decrease the quality of finished compost.

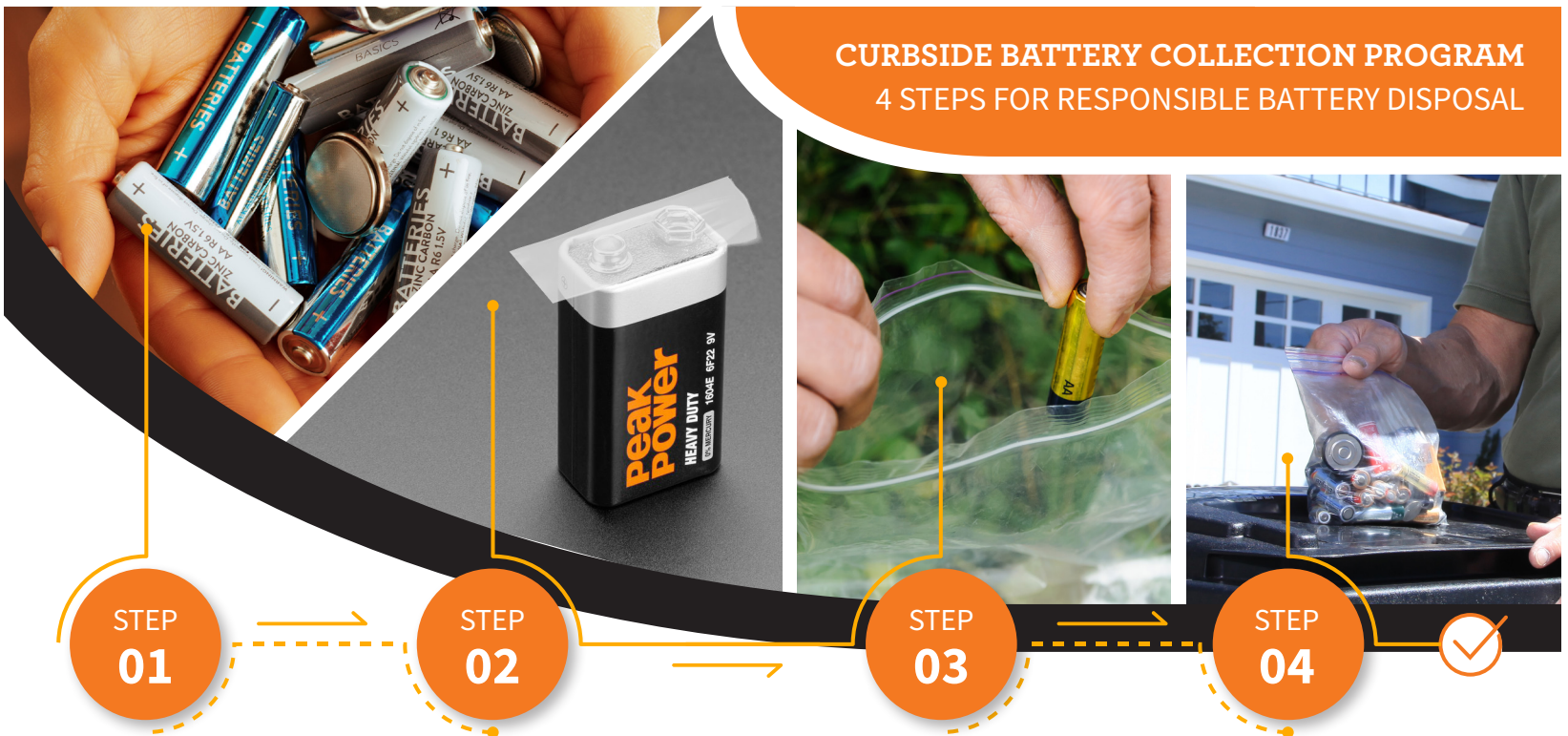
Compost materials, such as food scraps, food and beverage soiled paper products, and yard trimmings, belong in the compost bin. Compost materials should not be disposed of in a plastic bag. Flimsy plastics such as plastic grocery or produce bags belong in the black landfill bin.

CURBSIDE BATTERY COLLECTION PROGRAM 4 STEPS FOR RESPONSIBLE BATTERY DISPOSAL



1: COLLECT IT!

Do you have dead batteries collecting in a drawer?
Collect ALL your household batteries.

2: TAPE IT!

Prevent battery fires by using **clear tape** over lithium-ion and 9-volt battery terminals.

3: BAG IT!

Put all your batteries into a **clear plastic zip-top bag** to prevent spills.

4: PLACE IT!

Place your sealed bag on top of your black garbage cart on your regular collection day.
