#### CUSTOMER PORTAL NEWS

The new Customer Portal allows you to access your bill, make payments, and more. All customers, even those previously enrolled in paperless billing or automatic payments, must re-enroll in the new portal.

You can create an account or you can make a onetime guest payment. To sign up, you will be asked for your **invoice number** (statement or billing number) and your **customer number** (account number) found on the paper statement sent to **every** customer for this first billing cycle with our new system.


Your account number has been updated, so be sure to locate the new one as your old account number will not be recognized.

#### FREE FALL CLEANUP

- WHEN: 10 AM 2 PM, Saturday, October 19
- WHERE: Park-and-Ride lot on the corner of Lemon Street and Curtola Parkway
- WHO: Unincorporated Vallejo residents only. Must show proof of residency with a picture ID and garbage or utility bill. Your Recology account must be paid in full and not past due.
- WHAT: Up to 4 cubic yards per household. Hazardous waste and tires are not accepted.

#### SCHEDULE YOUR BIC TODAY!

Make an appointment for a free Bulky Item Collection (BIC) before all available time slots are taken. They fill up quickly as the year progresses.



Call **707.552.3110** in advance with your itemized list so we can get you scheduled.

Unincorporated residents receive one free pickup a

year that can be used for up to 2 cubic yards or the equivalent of (12) 32-gallon bags of trash or two oversized items such as old furniture or mattresses.

#### **BOPA HOURS**

Residents can drop off batteries, oil, paint, antifreeze, and other household waste at the Vallejo Materials Recovery Facility, 8 AM – 3:30 PM Thursday through Saturday. The facility is located at 2021 Broadway.

DO compost soiled paper towels, napkins, egg cartons, newspaper, cardboard (even pizza boxes!), and paper plates without plastic coating.

**PRO TIP:** If a paper product has a shiny surface, it is probably coated in plastic and should go into the trash.

**DO** store food scraps in the freezer so they stay out of the elements while waiting for pickup day. Move them to your green bin before you take it to the curb for collection.



**PRO TIP**: If you put food scraps in a plain brown paper bag for freezing, the whole package can go directly in the bin.

#### DO put food scraps directly into the green bin. No plastic bags.

**PRO TIP**: Line your green bin with dry grass clippings or other yard waste or used and uncoated paper products to keep odors in check.

**DON'T** be confused by compostable plastics. These often don't break down as advertised and should not go in your green carts. Please place these in your landfill (trash) bin.
