RECYCLING, COMPOSTING

Yvonne Jacobs has served diners delicious meals for 20 years at **My Homestyle Café**. Over the past couple of years, after working with Recology Vallejo Waste Zero specialists, she has become a proponent of recycling and composting, reducing the discards she sends to landfill and her garbage bill.

"I found out how to recycle, and now I know better," says Jacobs, noting that she now separates cardboard, bottles, and cans for recycling and kitchen scraps and plate scrapings for composting. "I don't need the big garbage cans anymore, so I was able to downsize and save money."

The restaurant at 523 Marin St. went from a large 1-yard metal bin to a

64-gallon garbage cart. Jacobs says the change has "saved me a lot of money" and is doing something good for the environment.

Learning sorting techniques took some getting used to, says Jacobs, but thanks to guidance from Recology Waste Zero specialists, she and her sister, My Homestyle Café's only employee, are confident about knowing what goes in which bin.

UNACCEPTABLE

No plastic bags

No tanglers (ropes, hoses, bags)

No electronics

No hazardous waste (batteries, oil, paint, chemicals)

No small or flimsy plastics (packaging, utensils, wrappers, bags)

No ceramics or dishware
No scrap metal



PLEASE REMEMBER:

Empty recyclables of food or liquid, keeping them as clean and dry as possible. Some light residue is okay.

Recycling is sorted by hand. Place recyclables loose in your blue cart.

SUSTAINABILITY HIERARCHY

REFUSE: Buy only what you need, use what you have.

REDUCE: Limit the amount of products used.

REUSE: Donate items that still have life in them.

RECYCLE: Put recyclables loose and dry into your blue bin.

ROT: Put food scraps, food-soiled paper, and yard waste in the green bin for composting.
