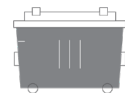

My Recology Service

TEMPORARY BOXES



Recology offers 3, 10, 20, and 30 cubic yard boxes. You will need an asbestos survey for construction or demolition of all structures built prior to 2004 before a box can be delivered to you. Contact customer service for more information and to order.

BULKY ITEM PICK UP



Recology collects mattresses, appliances, TVs, and more! Service charges and disposal fees apply. Contact customer service for more information.

COLLECTION TIME



Set your cart out by 6 AM on your collection day. Your actual service time may vary from week to week. Many cities require that carts are brought back in within 24 hours after collection to ensure public right of way. This includes sidewalks, driveways, and roadsides.

BATTERY RECYCLING

Improperly discarded household batteries can spark and cause fires when not handled properly, creating dangerous situations for garbage and recycling truck drivers and processing facilities.

SAFE HANDLING: Please tape ends of all batteries, except alkaline, with clear tape. For coin/button cell batteries, wrap tape around the entire battery. If you have multiple hearing aid or other coin/button cell batteries, lay out a long strip of packing tape, place the batteries on the tape—be sure not to let them touch each other—and place another long strip of tape on top. You may drop household, auto, rechargeable batteries off for free at Astoria Transfer Station.

E-WASTE

Oregon e-cycles is a free recycling program for computers, TVs, and monitors. Drop off items at Astoria Transfer Station. Limit seven items per visit.

PAINT RECYCLING

All paint sold in Oregon includes a surcharge to fund a collection and recycling program. Visit paintcare.org for details.

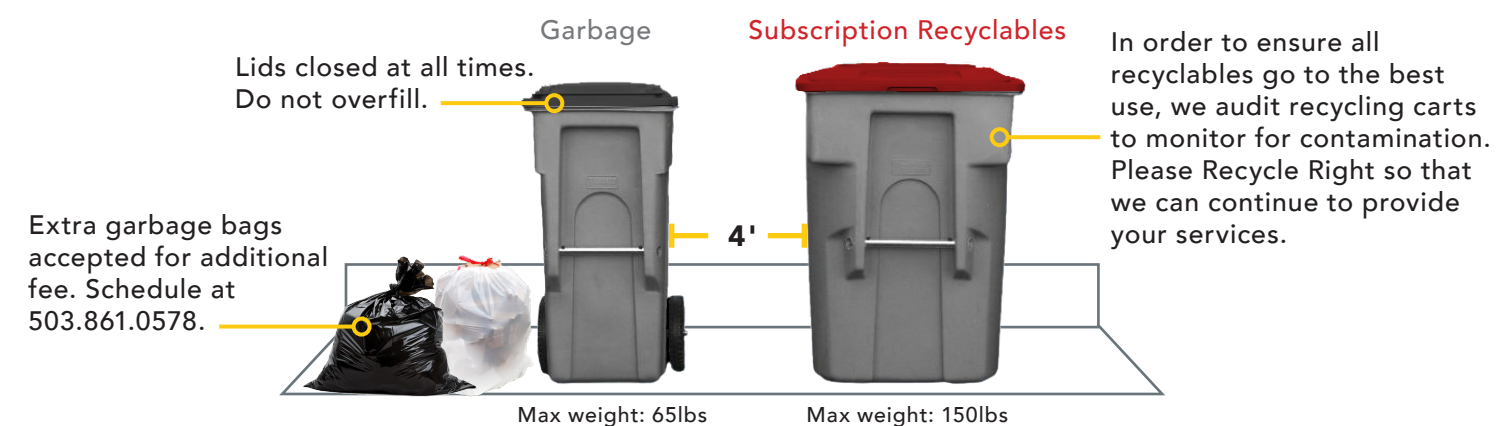
YARD DEBRIS

Customers can bring their clean yard trimmings to the Manzanita Transfer Station. All customers are charged by the cubic yard to drop off material.



Curbside Set-Out

Place carts curbside by 6 AM on your service day. Place 4ft apart and 4ft from all obstacles.



Side yard carts must be within 40' of curb, outside gates and fences, visible from the street. Other restrictions may apply.

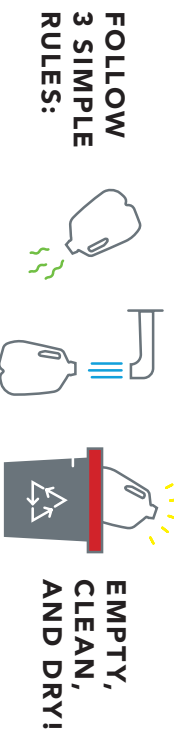

EMPTY Any residual food or liquid

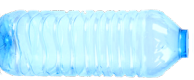
CLEAN The container with a quick rinse or scrape

DRY allow the moisture to dry before you bring it to the recycling center



CARDBOARD AND MIXED PAPER

Flattened boxes, paper bags, cereal boxes, mail, newspaper, magazines



PLASTIC

Plastic bottles #1 & #2 only (no lids)



METAL

Tin and aluminum cans (no lids)



GLASS

Glass bottles and jars (no glass dishware or drinking glasses and no lids)



ELECTRONICS

Tin and aluminum cans (no lids)



CLOTHING AND SHOES



YARD WASTE

Grass, leaves, branches, flowers (no dirt, sod, stumps or animal waste)



USED OIL

Motor oil and cooking oil, use a see-through jug with a tight-fitting lid.

UNACCEPTED ITEMS

- No Plastic Bags
- No Food

- No Glass
