Examples of what to bring

- Cleaning supplies (window cleaner, drain cleaner, bathroom cleaner, anything containing bleach or ammonia)
- · Pesticides and insecticides
- Swimming pool chemicals
- Weed killers not currently approved for use
- Paint remover
- · Old or toxic wood preservatives
- Light ballasts
- Alkaline and rechargeable batteries
- Thermostats containing mercury
- E-Cigarettes

What NOT to bring

- No paint*
- No 55-gallon drums
- No fluorescent light tubes*
- No medical or biological waste*
- No asbestos*
- No propane tanks*
- No antifreeze*
- · No explosives
- No radioactive materials
- No ammunition
- · No commercial or industrial waste
- No waste in containers larger than 5 gallons
- * Use other local recycle/disposal options



What about paint?

We do not accept paint at this event.

Thanks to an Oregon law enacted in 2010, there are now local paint stores that will accept your latex and oil-based paints year-round. Go to **paintcare.org** and enter your zip code to find participating stores in your area. We recommend calling the store to make sure they have room to accept your paint before you visit.

Safety protocol

Once you're on site, please remain in your vehicle. Trained hazardous waste personnel will come to you and remove the items from your vehicle. Wherever possible, please put items to be disposed of in your trunk or rear section of your car. Once in the unloading area, please turn off your vehicle, open the trunk or pop the hatch and we'll take care of the rest.

The re-use table puts household hazardous waste to good use

Experienced site chemists will be on hand all day to sort through everything that comes in — setting the "still usable" items on a special table. These carefully chosen, safely packaged items are yours to take, free! Stop by and see what's available.

Does your business have hazardous waste?

This service is by application only and appointments are made in advance. Fees are charged according to the type and volume of waste being disposed.
